Program Eligibility Guidelines



What is Deconstruction?

Deconstruction involves the careful dismantling of buildings with the goal of preserving reusable materials, resulting in at least 70% landfill diversion.

Whereas nearly anyone with sufficient strength can wield a sledgehammer on a demolition crew, a properly trained deconstruction worker knows how to disassemble a building in the correct order, using the appropriate tools, with minimal damage.

He or she is able to handle materials deftly, organize them strategically and prepare them for safe shipment to recycling or resale centers. Wages for this skilled labor are typically in the range of \$15-20/hr.

Program Schedule

- **Training Dates:** Sept. 20, 2010 - Oct 1, 2010
- **Class Time:** Monday - Friday , 9:30am - 4:30pm
- Training will be divided between the classroom and a deconstruction job site

Upon completion, students will:

- Have knowledge of OSHA General Construction Safety Guidelines
- Have theoretical and hands-on training in a green construction methodology
- Understand the economic and environmental benefits of deconstruction
- Be better qualified to compete for quality jobs

Qualifications

To be eligible for this program, one must be:

1. 18 or older
2. A resident of specific South Seattle neighborhoods, and one or more of the following:
 - Unemployed
 - High-school dropout
 - Re-entry/ex-offender
 - Veteran, or
 - Low or no-income and in need of updated training related to energy efficiency and renewable energy industries
3. Legal to work in the U.S.
4. Registered with the Selective Service (for men born 1960 or later) or have entered the U.S. after age 26
5. Priority given to veterans and eligible spouses

Training Requirements:

- Ability to lift up to 50 lbs.
- Ability to wear breathing restricting protective gear (respirators, dust masks, etc)
- Understand basic English (verbal) to follow simple instructions and safety information
- Drug-free with possible spot-testing; not under the influence of alcohol with possible testing
