Need a job or job training? *Go green!*

Green jobs are good jobs! With short-term training, you could be working at **\$15 an hour and up**—and be on a pathway to further training and better jobs.

Free training for jobs in:

- Green construction
- Manufacturing
- Weatherization
- Deconstruction

With the GreenLight Project, you'll:

- **Get support** with transportation, work clothes, child care or other needs keeping you from your goals
- **Connect to real jobs** at local companies

Are you eligible for GreenLight?

To be eligible for the GreenLight Project, you must be:

1. 18 or older
2. A resident of specific South Seattle neighborhoods (based on address) and one or more of the following:
 - Unemployed
 - High-school dropout
 - Ex-offender
 - Veteran, or
 - Low or no-income and in need of updated training related to energy efficiency/renewable energy industries
3. Legal to work in the U.S.
4. Registered with Selective Service (for men born in 1960 or later) or have entered the U.S. after age 26
5. Priority will be given to veterans and eligible spouses

Pre-Apprenticeship and Construction Training

Seattle Vocational Institute

Training dates: Sept. 27—Dec. 16, 2010

Class hours: Monday-Friday evenings and most Saturdays

Upon completion, students will:

- Successfully complete certifications for flagging, forklift, OSHA 10, First Aid/CPR
- Successfully complete carpenter's test
- Have basic math proficiency
- Understand basic tools and building materials
- Have potential to be referred to Seattle Housing Authority construction jobs

CLASS FULL

Energy Efficiency and Weatherization Training

Got Green and Laborers' Intl. Union of North America (LIUNA)

Training dates: 3 weeks in Feb – March 2011, followed by 6 weeks of on-the-job field training in April 2011

Training includes:

- Preparation for Weatherization Installer/Tech certificate
- General construction safety
- Light plumbing and electrical
- Work readiness/life skills
- Related math/communications/customer service
- Six weeks of on-the job training on housing units
- Graduates will become preferred applicants for LIUNA's building trades apprenticeship program

Deconstruction

CleanEdison

Training dates: 10-day training over 2 weeks; starts Sept. 20

Training includes:

- Safety & OSHA Standards; tools/equipment
- Deconstruction sequence/variations; layered materials
- On-site full deconstruction; detaching components/shipment prep
- Teamwork; loading & unloading materials

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Pre-Apprenticeship in Green Manufacturing

South Seattle Community College and partners

Training dates: Classes start Fall 2010; Winter & Spring 2011

Class hours: 35 hours/week for 10 weeks

Training includes:

- Orientation to green jobs and workplace readiness
- Safety training such as first aid/CPR
- OSHA 10; tool safety; falls/scaffolds; haz. materials
- Applied math and physics; basic mechanical principles
- Use of hand tools
- Safety training and safety certification for completers
- Linkages to apprenticeships and jobs through the Aerospace Joint Apprenticeship Committee (AJAC) and the Manufacturing Industrial Council (MIC)
- Certain eligibility requirements will apply

Intro to Green Manufacturing (youth 18-24)

King County, South Seattle Community College & Manufacturing Industrial Council

Training dates: Throughout 2010-11

Class hours: 35 hours/week for 10 weeks; 8-4:30 Mon-Fri

Training includes:

- Exposure to multiple trades, including electrical, welding, masonry, carpentry, painting and plumbing
- Certifications in safety, flagging and other areas
- Paid stipends
- A four-week paid internship with a local employer
